



Bubble Up Creative Practitioner Brief

Context:

Bubble Up is an innovative out of school hours recovery learning programme from arts education charity <u>Curious Minds</u>. It is designed to nurture new forms of artistic partnership at hyperlocal level, positioning cultural learning as a driver for education recovery, reconnection and readiness to learn. <u>https://bubbleup.org.uk/</u>

The Department for Education (DFE) is funding secondary schools to run Summer Schools, to help incoming year 7s transition into their new school setting. Some schools may identify other young people who they feel would benefit from attending.

Curious Minds believes that young people need a summer of arts, culture, creativity and fun experiences, which have largely been absent over the last year. Teachers and school staff need a break after a very challenging year and we think that the creative and cultural workforce can help make this happen.

The Bubble Up programme is designed to support schools by taking the work of commissioning high quality freelance practitioners or arts and cultural organisations to deliver creative engaging creative activities, ensuring quality through training, support and evaluation of the summer schools.

Schools may identify specific outcomes and outputs they wish to achieve, but the overarching outcomes for transition are:

- Enjoy new experiences
- Build confidence
- Develop positive patterns of behaviour
- Reinforce Learning
- Creativity
- Love of learning
- Feeling comfortable with others
- Feeling hopeful and positive

Bubble Up developed as a hyper-local programme, designed to highlight and develop arts and cultural activity within specific geographic areas. This doorstep delivery model will help children and young people become aware of and more able to access high quality arts experiences in their community. To make this happen, we are particularly interested in engaging freelancers and arts organisations that are established within the school community area. We hope that this approach will help develop longer term partnerships between the creative practitioner, schools and children and young people.
